Woodstove Safety Tips from your Fire Department

Rushville Fire Department Woodstoves and fireplaces are a popular alternative heating source for many homeowners, especially those who own older model homes. Make sure to take the proper following precautions to ensure that you enjoy the added comfort while minimizing the risk to your family and home.

- Open the dampers before starting a fire in a wood stove.
- Vent your stove properly and insulate vent from flammable materials.
- Keep dry wood away from the stove.
- Remember that slow burning fires can create creosote and soot problems; small hot fires are more efficient.
- Use paper and kindling wood to ignite a fire. Avoid using lighter fluid, kerosene, or gasoline.

Scheduled Maintenance:

Weekly: We recommend cleaning the ashes from your stove every week during the heating season. Dispose of ashes in a metal container with a lid and store away from your home and combustibles.

Monthly: Inspect your pipes and connections monthly for creosote and soot build-up.

Warning Signs of Chimney Problems:

- Build up of creosote (dripping from the base of the chimney or staining of the outer chimney shell)
- Sluggish draft (smoke spilling out when the woodstove door is opened)

Smoke Detector and Carbon Monoxide Detector Tips

Test all detectors at least once a month. Nearly all smoke detectors have a test button, simply push the test button and the alarm will sound.

It's recommended to change your battery at least twice per year.

Clean detectors at least once a year. Dust and other particles in the air can build up over time and decrease the sensitivity of a smoke detector. The best way to clean a smoke detector is with a vacuum hose.

Replace the entire detector at least once every 3-5 years. Smoke detectors do wear out over time.

Hard-wired detectors should be tested, cleaned, and replaced just as often as non-wired smoke detectors.

Every bedroom should have a smoke detector and a carbon monoxide detector. It's also recommended to put one in living rooms, kitchens and hallways, and on each level having a gas fire or wood burring appliance. You can never have too many!

IMPORTANT NOTICE!

If you do not have a smoke detector installed in your home, the Rushville Fire Department has i a limited amount of free smoke detectors that they will provide and install (one per family) for l residents within the Rushville Fire District.
